- I. Welcome and Roll Call—Dr. Shone (5 min)
- II. Approval of September 18th Meeting Minutes—Dr. Shone (5 min)
 - a. There was a motion and second; the minutes were approved.
- III. Opening Remarks—Secretary Cohen, if available (5 min)
- IV. New Business
 - a. *Test Trends and Hot Topics*—Drs. Tilson, Moore, and Shone (15 min)
 - i. NC entered Phase 2.5 about 3 weeks ago.
 - ii. NC has not seen a big surge or a big decline; number of cases have been stable.
 - iii. Percent positive is decreasing and is ~5%.
 - iv. If the trends stay stable, NC may move to a Phase 3.
 - v. NC will be issuing various guidance documents in the near future, such as Halloween guidance.
 - vi. Starting today (9/25), the public facing dashboard will show tests broken down by molecular and antigen, and deaths associated with a PCR positive or an antigen positive.
 - b. Antigen Test Deployment Update—Dr. Aditi Mallick (15 min)
 - HHS is deploying antigen Abbott BinaxNOW tests to all 50 states HHS has already sent Abbott BinaxNOW tests to 256 nursing homes, 443 assisted living facilities, and 5 HBCUs in NC.
 - ii. NC DHHS is unsure of how many antigen tests NC will receive from HHS; anticipating the 2nd wave of distribution coming to NC at earliest next week; to be distributed at the State's discretion.
 - iii. Need the Test Surge Workgroup's feedback on the best populations and areas for antigen deployment.
 - iv. Scientific Council will convene next week to talk about antigen guidance and will follow up to see if there is any existing EUA data on kids.
 - v. Pre-decisional discussion followed around the following questions; no decisions were made.
 - What circumstances are best suited for this test? (one time vs. ongoing cadence) (congregate settings vs. settings where people come and go).
 - What target populations do you think are best suited for this test?



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- Any use cases that are better for BinaxNOW relative to other antigen tests?
- Concerns or challenges you foresee that need to be taken into consideration?
 - a. Need clear guidance on what to do with a negative test.
 - b. The volume of tests that NC gets determines the answer to some of these questions.
 - c. Need messaging on a population level.

 - i. Abbott is re-labeling the Abbott ID Now tests to be similar to the Abbott BinaxNOW tests (antigen tests).
