



Prevents COVID-19

The vaccines teach your body how to fight COVID-19 and keep you from getting very sick or dying.



No COVID-19 in the vaccine

There is no virus in the vaccines, so you cannot get COVID-19 from the vaccines.



Private

Your personal information is protected and is not shared with ICE or the CDC.



Built on science

The vaccines are built on years of work to make vaccines for similar viruses.



Short-term reactions are normal

You may experience temporary reactions: sore arm, fever, headache, feeling tired and achy for a day or two after being vaccinated. These are signs your body is building protection.



For everyone teens and older

Everyone 12+ can receive a free COVID-19 vaccine.



Safe and effective

Millions of people in the U.S. have already been safely vaccinated.



Free

The COVID-19 vaccines are free to everyone even if you don't have insurance.

Ask for your **safe and effective** COVID-19 vaccine.

Protect yourself, your family and your community.

Did you know?



People who live or work in jails and prisons are more likely to get sick from COVID-19 because people are close together and can more easily spread the virus to each other.



The vaccines will keep you from getting very sick or dying.



You cannot get COVID-19 from the vaccines.



It is normal for your arm to feel sore, to feel tired and achy or have a low fever or headache for a few days after getting vaccinated.

Know your 3 Ws!



WEAR
a cloth mask over
your nose and mouth.



WAIT
6 feet apart. Avoid
close contact.



WASH
your hands or use
hand sanitizer.

The 3 Ws are everyone's best protection against COVID-19 until more people are vaccinated.
